### **General Announcements**

- Leaders in the community have come together to build an online mental health toolkit for students, staff, and families. This toolkit is available on ([website link](#)). ### **Mental Health Days**

- A legislation addressing mental health has been recently implemented in schools. With this new legislation, schools provide mental health days for students. Like sick days, students can be called out of school without a doctor's note for up to 5 days. Once a student requests a second mental health day, a school counselor will be in contact with the student's caregivers about any concerns or to refer them to professional help.

### **Back of Student ID Contacts**

- A new policy has been passed in Illinois schools to include mental health help on the back of student ID cards. This will be put into effect on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. The back of student IDs in grades 7-12 will include the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, the Crisis Text Line, and a local suicide prevention hotline.
